#### **Executive Director's Report**

Greetings Members;

Last month I advised that our Board had asked the Administration to review the operation of our Music Jam program because of some concerns raised over the large attendance at this program. Of specific import, were comments concerning potential problems relating to emergency exiting and adherence to fire safety / building code. Other issues involved the attendance at weekly Jams of individuals neither members of Nord-Bridge, nor quests of members; and matters relating to member and Jammer convenience, revenues, volunteer staffing, logistics, etc. (Please see the January Newsletter for further background). As a result, attendees, Jammers, and staff were surveyed for input during the month of December 2010, and early January 2011. The Association also experimented holding Jams on Tuesday afternoons early in the month. All the input, results, and in-progress data was then taken to the Board at its' January meeting. The conclusion, by almost unanimous Board resolution, was to keep the Jam program running on Monday's from 10 am to noon (only 1 Board member preferred Tuesday's). Revenues was a major factor in the decision. Your Administration was also **directed** to develop some clearer rules concerning the Monday Jams, and to post these rules near the Dining Room and Annex entrance(s). Jam rules will also occasionally be published in this Newsletter. Actual rules are still to be developed, so if you have further input speak with a staff member, or someone on the Board. However, at this stage, rules suggested include:

- Tables/chairs are not to be moved so as to block aisles.
- Newspapers from the Reading Lounge are not to be taken into the Jam area / Dining Room.
- Tables are not to be saved. Seating is first come / first served.
- Complimentary coffee is for Jammers only. Not spouse.




