

This year though, is going to be different for my family, my children in particular, as their dad passed away this year. I know many of you also lost someone very special and loved this year. The holiday season can magnify your sense of loss and mourning. Family gatherings and seasonal events can be painful reminders of the absence of a loved one. If you are mourning the loss of a loved one this year, here are some important things to keep in mind.

ONLY DO WHAT FEELS RIGHT FOR YOU: Decide which activities or traditions you can handle.

ACCEPT YOUR FEELINGS: Whatever they might be, feel the feelings and accept that you will have moments of deep sadness and perhaps some guilt if you do feel joy.

CALL ON FAMILY AND FRIENDS: Talk to your loved ones and be honest about how you need to do things this year.

Focus on THE KIDS: Spending time with children as they marvel in the season can be a welcome distraction. Give yourself permission to excuse yourself if it is too much.

PLAN AHEAD: Anticipation can be worse than the actual holiday. Plan small moments to look forward to instead of dreading the pain the holiday could bring.

SCALE BACK: Do what feels safe and comfortable for you. If the thought of many activities feels overwhelming, bow out and be gentle with yourself.

GIVE: Sometimes it is a comfort to give to others. Consider volunteering; make a donation to a charity in your loved one's name or give a gift to someone who may not receive anything. ACKNOWLEDGE YOUR LOSS: Light a candle of remembrance, talk about them, display their picture among holiday items. Do something different: Things have changed and the holidays will not be the same. Plan new activities or create a new tradition.

SKIP IT: If you genuinely feel it is going to be too much for you, or that having other family members around may be just too much to endure, you have the right to opt out of big events. Speak with your family and truthfully share your feelings with them.

As always, if you are struggling dealing with your loss, please, I invite you to come sit and have a chat with me. Together we can come up with a plan that honours your wishes and also pays homage to your loved one.

top Winter Falls. Walk like a penguin! Know why?
They walk flat footed. They take short strides. They walk with their arms at their sides (not in their pockets).
They concentrate on maintaining balance. Don't fall! Follow these simple tips:

- Choose footwear that will provide traction on snow and ice.
- ♦ Plan ahead; think about the best route to your destination and give yourself a little extra time to get there.
- **♦ Walk on designated walkways**. It can be hazardous to take shortcuts over snow piles or areas that cannot be cleared.
- Don't carry heavy objects in slippery conditions.
- ♦ Beware of "black ice" and slippery conditions on surfaces that have been cleared. Water vapour can freeze on cold surfaces and form an extra-thin, nearly invisible layer of ice that can look like a wet spot on the pavement. It often shows up early in the morning, in areas that are shaded from the sun and sunny spots where puddles freeze after dusk.
- Before you step off the curb into the street, make sure any approaching **vehicles have come to a complete stop**.
- Walk slowly and keep both hands out to stay balanced.
- **Use handrails** while walking up and down stairs.
- ♦When exiting or entering a vehicle, hold on to it for support.
- When entering a building, be sure to **use floor mats and boot cleaners** to remove moisture from the soles of your shoes. This will help protect you, as well as others who follow.
- Choose your path carefully to avoid wet or slippery floors.


