EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members:

Welcome to 2017, a Municipal election year! I hope your festive season has been pleasant, and that your outlook for the coming year is positive. Of course, we only have partial control of the future, but I know your friends at Nord-Bridge will be there to make your life pleasurable, and we will work to help each other overcome any challenges.



I am pleased to report that 2016 was good to your Association, as we ended the year (as at Dec. 29) with 1,353 members. This means 2016 membership exceeded any total over the prior ten years. In 2006 we had another 100 members, but back then our membership fees were just \$15 per year. At the City's encouragement fees were raised, and it has taken us ten years to rebuild membership to a comparable level (lest the City gets in mind that fees are too low again). I note that Nord-Bridge's fees are now higher than any other major senior centre in Alberta; however, I believe most members feel they are getting good value for their dues. Over the last 10 years we have addressed revenues with the addition of user fees in the gym, the pool hall, and for many programs. Thanks for your support.

Membership renewals for 2017 are now due. **Over 56% of mem**

Membership renewals for 2017 are now due. Over 56% of members have already renewed, and we ask the rest of you to do so as soon as possible. We send out membership renewal reminders at the first of February, but with postage now at \$0.85 cents, and additional administrative costs, it would help greatly if you pay before re-

minders are generated and mailed.

Congratulations to our Seniors Helping Seniors team! In 2016 you completed 1,432 current year tax returns, another 412 late returns, and helped another large group of citizens with consultations and referrals to various services and funding programs. Total consults and free services helped 2,874 individuals, many of whom were non-members of Nord-Bridge.

Wednesday, March 1, 2017, 9:30 a.m. Nominations Notice for Board & Executive Positions

At the Association's upcoming Annual General Meeting, scheduled for March 1, 2017, 9:30 am, the membership of Nord-Bridge will be asked to elect a new Executive. This occurs annually. Executive Officers can serve a maximum of 3 years in the same position, excepting for the Treasurer and Board Secretary who can be elected for extended terms. In 2017 our membership will minimally elect (or re-elect) the President and Vice-President. Members will also be asked to vote on the election of the Treasurer and Board Secretary. In addition, there will be at least 3 new Directors elected to the Board at the March 1, 2017 AGM. Directors on the Board are elected from members of the Society in "good standing", per By-Law Item 7.1.4.

A special "Thank You" is offered to our Watercolor group for their generous donation of \$100 to our Outreach








