EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members,

I am pleased to report that we have now concluded a lease agreement with Kilkenny Services to operate an Osteoporosis Clinic within the Nord-Bridge Centre property. Opening September 5, in the space between Medicine Shoppe Pharmacy and the Salon Nineteen04 hairdressers, this is an exceptional service to become available at our Centre. Canadian statistics suggest one in three women, and one in five men will suffer from an osteoporotic fracture during their lifetime. This



"silent" deterioration of bone mass and tissue, increases the risk of fractures (broken bones), particularly of the hip, spine, wrist and shoulder. The overall cost to the Canadian healthcare system in treating osteoporosis and the fractures it causes was over \$2.3 billion in 2010. These costs include acute care, outpatient costs, prescription drugs, etc. The costs were really even higher when one factors in the portion Canadians are paying when the condition leads to living in long-term care facilities. And of course, osteoporosis reduces quality of life, causes disfigurement, lowers self esteem, limits mobility, and decreases independence. Chloe Kilkenny is a trained educator with Osteoporosis Canada, and manages the Alberta Chapter of the organization from here in Lethbridge. She, her husband Jared, and others will staff this office, delivering the "Bone Fit" Program of Osteoporosis Canada. They will work with regional health care staff and doctor's offices in health and wellness training, fitness and nutrition, and post-operative supports for older adults. Their lease at Nord -Bridge provides for some specific time allotments within our Fitness Centre, where they will work with osteo patients; and they will have some access to our Community Room for training events and workshops. This access will be scheduled during slower user periods by our current membership. We trust this will become a valued service at our Centre. Let us know. We also hope to gain new members.

HENSON TRUSTS - For Alberta?

Brian Malkinson, MLA for Calgary-Currie has sponsored a private members bill in the Alberta Legislature to allow for Henson Trusts in Alberta. A Henson Trust is used to hold an inheritance for the benefit of a handicapped individual, which will not affect their eligibility for income support programs like Alberta Income Support for the Handicapped (AISH). Alberta remains the only jurisdiction in Canada that does not allow for this type of discretionary Henson trust, which was made possible by the Supreme Court of Ontario in 1989. They ruled that Henson trust assets were not vested in the beneficiary, and thus could not be used to terminate government benefit programs. This is because a Henson Trust as previously stated is fully-discretionary, and set up differently from an ordinary trust. It is held in the name of the handicapped child, as well as other people, usually the child's siblings. Payments out of the trust are discretionally, and are made as the trustee decides. The child has no right to demand that any payment be made. The trustee decides to whom it is paid, and how much. Thus a high level of confidence is required of the trustee.

Currently in Alberta, a limit of \$100K can be held in a standard trust, and any income over \$800 per month flowing to the beneficiary would affect their AISH payments. Were Henson trust allowed in Alberta, the trust could be used to hold assets and purchase services and support for beneficiaries. Individuals can also have up to \$200K in their RDSP as well as ownership of a vehicle and a home exempt from AISH claw back.

MLA Maria Fitzpatrick will be hosting a consultation on these trusts, to glean input and the opinion of Nord-Bridge members. Should the public support the concept of allowing for Henson trusts, the Parliamentary Counsel's office would draft legislation to be advanced to the Legislature.


