

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members:

Twenty plus years ago when I joined Nord-Bridge as the Executive Director, I was hoping we could take a relatively small non-profit, and build it into a stable and vibrant force for seniors in our community. At the time Nord-Bridge had 265 loyal [current or former] north-siders as members, and we had existed in various locations for some 20 years. The Association had registered as a society in 1980, and we had moved into the Bill Kergan Centre in 1984. Our rent paid to



the City in 1998 was \$26,603 dollars. At the end of 1998, We had cash and assets of \$288,000, including a Building Fund Reserve of \$160,000.

I am rather proud of the fact that today, Nord-Bridge owns its own building, recently appraised for insurance purposes at \$5 million. Today's City Tax Assessment is just short of \$3.5 million. The higher number is likely more reflective of a conservative replacement cost. Thus regardless of what the final number would total, we are fortunate to have significant assets, and no bank debt on our building. We made our last payment on the Centre in 2012. But more importantly, the Nord-Bridge Seniors Centre is well used by 1,400 members annually, who attend some 75 programs each season in the Centre, many of which are offered on multiple occasions each week. Daily visitation at Nord-Bridge ranges between 200 and 250 people, and this does not include the general public who visit our seniors centre for various community events, services, and evening rentals. Nord-Bridge in real terms is the most well attended / active multi-purpose public use facility in North Lethbridge. We have certainly come a long way since our humble beginnings around a North Lethbridge kitchen table. We are one of the largest seniors centres in the Province, and one of only a few who own and operate their own facility. In every other instance, those that do have equity in a facility operate on municipal or provincial lands, and operating costs are generally subsidized.

Nothing that Nord-Bridge has done over the last twenty years could have been accomplished without engaging in many, many collaborations. Our members, funders, colleagues, community organizations, board members, staff, volunteers, and instructors have all contributed to make Nord-Bridge a place with programs and services that address individual needs, and build on the strengths of the seniors we serve.

I would like to express my gratitude to everyone who has contributed to the success of Nord-Bridge over the last many years. To colleagues from the City, the Province, the Federal Government, the Community Foundation, the City's educational institutions, local non-profits, and to a great business community, I express sincere thanks. You have all made my job fulfilling. When I decided to retire, I knew this was the right time. We have just completed a multi-year Strategic Plan that looks forward over the next few years. This plan also sets out goals to be achieved as Nord-Bridge advances into the future. We have a keen governance in place, and certainly a strong staff who are capable in delivering valued programs and services. Our volunteers are superb and are willing to take on significant and rewarding roles.

To everyone who has participated in, worked for or with Nord-Bridge, thank you for all you have done to make our Seniors organization such a vital part of the lives of so many individuals. Each of you have contributed to making Nord-Bridge a warm and welcoming place that meets the needs and supports the strength of seniors. Nord-Bridge has certainly achieved its goal or motto of being known as "The Friendly Centre".

My job as Executive Director has been so enjoyable and rewarding because of the amazing people with whom I have worked.



The Nord-Bridge Travel Program continues to run smoothly offering trips geared for our members interests and mobility. Our travelers like to get out and experience cultural and entertaining venues and attractions in and around our community. Trips are planned and organized by our Nord-Bridge staff Travel Co-coordinator, Valerie Arkinstall, who wel-



comes destination recommendations from our members. Our program is especially popular with those who wish to get on the road, and see the sights, but don't drive.


Last year we organized 31 trips and are on-track for a similar number this year. Ten were "mystery" trips which were particularly popular and sold out quickly. Other destinations included: Our third annual junket to Cranbrook-St. Eugene Casino Resort; Millarville Christmas Craft Show; Bar-U Historical Ranch; Hillspring Great Canadian Barn Dance; Brooks Dinosaur Provincial Park; Calgary Zoo Lights; the popular Picture Butte Island trip organized by Fred and Alice Mehlhaff; a Hutterite Colony; a Calgary shopping mall; Stage West, Rosebud; Raymond Dinner Theatre; the Pincher Creek Fishing Derby; local Movie Mill; Broxburn Café; Saskatoon Berry Farm; and Waterton Lakes National Park. We also offered "Out & About" whereby we take a group to Walmart twice a month to shop for personal items or groceries, or just browse or walk inside the store. This was especially helpful for our members during the cold months.

The success of our program depends on a volunteer staff of at least three or four drivers who must hold a Class 5 license and a good driver's record. Volunteer drivers are used when we run our own 13 passenger bus. These trips are priced on mileage, which increased in 2017, plus an



administrative component. For trips with more passengers we contract with Carefree Express. Their motor coach can accommodate up to 56 passengers. Non-members are welcome to travel with us for an additional fee of \$25 per trip.


