

LORRI'S CORNER

June 15 was World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, (WEAAD) and The Lethbridge Elder Abuse Response Network (LEARN) hosted a fun event, a sock hop! The dance floor was filled with many people, most wearing purple! Each year the committee plans some activity to bring awareness that elder abuse occurs in our community.



Did you know that as a senior, you could be at risk? Elder abuse doesn't happen only to a people of a certain gender, race, ethnicity, income or education. Elder abuse is often committed by someone known to the victim, such as a family member, friend, neighbour or caregiver. Abusers can also include any individual in a position of power, trust or authority.

Elder abuse is any action or inaction that puts you at risk. It can take several forms including financial, emotional, physical, sexual, medication and neglect, with more than one type of abuse often occurring at the same time. Elder abuse can also include physical injury, restraint, financial exploitation, threats, ridicule, insult or humiliation, withholding medication, unwanted touching or sexual contact, forced isolation (physical or social), or forced change in living arrangements. It may also include neglect which includes abandonment, withholding or not providing food, healthcare, companionship or assistance.

I am on the Lethbridge Elder Abuse Response Network (LEARN) which is a group of organizations in the city that responds to and provides education, awareness and advocacy for those at risk of or already experiencing abuse, as well as the community at large. Joanne Blinco, Case Manager for LEARN is at Nord-Bridge the first and third Wednesday of the month from 10-12 in the Southview room.

I invite you to come see me in my office should you require assistance on this or any other concern you have. You are not alone.




Social Activities by Eva Deringer

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

In this month's Newsletter I want to update members on Nord-Bridge's Board of Directors December 11, 2017 public submission to City Council to review the funding between the two Seniors Centre in Lethbridge. From that submission, City Council directed Administration staff from the Community and Social Development (CSD) team to review operations and funding models for the delivery of senior services for both Nord-Bridge and LSCO.



The CSD department hired Hélène Wirzba of Wirzba Consulting in April to help complete research in the comparison of both Nord -Bridge and LSCO in terms of: history of the organizations, governance, facility and assets, membership, grants, sources of revenue, expenditures, and services and programs offered. I met with Hélène, and toured her around Nord-Bridge in late April. Hélène, took an in-depth analysis of Nord-Bridge's financial statements and operations. I highlighted many of the great things that Nord-Bridge has accomplished over the past 40 years; from 1978 when Nord-Bridge was established to meet the needs of seniors residing in North Lethbridge to our purchase of the Chinook Mall in 2001 and retrofitting the mall to what our current location is today as well as hosting the 2013 Grey Matters Conference (a provincial senior service providers conference). Hélène compiled all of her findings and produced the 35 page report "City of Lethbridge Review of Operations and Funding Models for the Delivery of Senior Services" for Nord-Bridge and LSCO.

This report was originally scheduled to be presented to City Council on May 28th, however Council voted to delay the presentation until June 11th. Then the Agenda Committee for Council decided the report would be made as a submission to Council rather than a presentation. Had the CSD department been able to present the report, it would have illustrated some of the key strengths both senior centres possess and conversely areas of weakness which both centres face challenges in. Council reviewed the submission at the June 11th meeting and all Council members voted in favour that the report be received as information and filed.

So what does this mean? Our hope is that Council will utilize the findings from this report when they engage in the 2019 - 2022 Operating Budget talks to address the shortfalls and challenges that Nord-Bridge faces. City Council now has a great snapshot of what Nord-Bridge does and where it sits in comparison to LSCO so that when the next four year Operating budget commences our hope is that Council takes the information from the report into account when they allot resources for seniors in our community with Nord-Bridge in mind. I have copies of this report if any members wish to read it. Please ask for a copy at the Reception Desk.


