



Good news for Nord-Bridge on the funding front. During its meeting of October 15, 2018 City Council approved Nord-Bridge's request of \$216,850.00 for Family and Community Support Services funding for 2019. This will allow us to continue to provide many of



our preventative social programs and volunteer opportunities.

New Manager of Community Social Development, Martin Thomsen, advised that the allocation process is about to become more rigorous next year, as the City moves to an evidenced-based system. The goal is to ensure the City is getting the outcomes it desires. Nord-Bridge will continue to offer preventative social programs that address the outcomes desired.

When Nord-Bridge designated the Gala as its major fund-raising social event, the future of the President's Dinner was in doubt. But after a successful President's Dinner and Auction in September, the Board decided there will be a 10th Anniversary Dinner after all. While the Nord-Bridge Gala celebrates our connection with the community, the President's Dinner will celebrate the incredible contributions made by presidents and other volunteers over the years. There will be less emphasis on the auction during this re-vamped event and more on the member experience.

Your Board of Directors is encouraging Nord-Bridge members to attend the General Meeting on Wednesday, November 7th at 9:30 a.m. in the Multi-Purpose Hall. Please record this event in your Google Calendar. Your president is promising free coffee and sweets and he will attempt to arrange musical entertainment as well. Why is it important for members to attend? If the Board doesn't receive your feedback, your concerns, and your thoughts about the future, it will find it very difficult to create a blueprint for Nord-Bridge's desired future.

A warm welcome to the twenty-one new members who joined in the month of October. And thanks to the many volunteers who contribute to Nord-Bridge in so many ways.

LORRI'S CORNER

Many years ago, when my kids were little, I worked as a nursing attendant at the Auxiliary Hospital in the locked Alzheimer's unit. I fondly recall many of the patients there that I was honoured to help. At the time, I didn't really know much about



Alzheimer's other than the very basics, senility was a term that was used at the time but it was understood that it was very different from Alzheimer's.

I spoke with **Shari Remus**, from the **Alzheimer Society in Lethbridge** and she was kind enough to provide some very interesting information to share with you. There are 564,000 Canadians with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias and it is predicted that number will reach 1 million in the next 15 years.

Dementia is not a specific disease. It is an umbrella term which describes a wide range of symptoms associated with a decline in memory or other thinking skills severe enough to reduce a person's ability to perform everyday activities.

There are over 200 different forms of dementia, with Alzheimer's being the most common form and this accounts for 64% of all dementias in Canada. Many people use the terms dementia and Alzheimer's interchangeably and it is important to understand that Alzheimer's and dementia are <u>not</u> considered a normal part of aging. Some common signs of **normal aging** include:

Not being able to remember the name of an acquaintance occasionally.

Sometimes having difficulties finding words.

Temporarily misplacing an item.

The 10 warning signs of dementia include: Memory loss that affects day to day abilities

(getting dressed, forgetting where you keep your socks)

Difficulty performing familiar tasks Problems with language Disorientation in time and space Impaired judgement Problems with Abstract thinking Misplacing things

Changes in mood or behaviours. Changes in personality

Loss of Initiative

In the early stages, which may be years, people with Alzheimer's can lead active lives after a diagnosis, continuing to work, drive, exercise and to handle many of the day to day activities that they have always done. In a recent study, Canadians affected by dementia



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members,

Last month, I was invited to the first session of the City of Lethbridge Community and Social Development 5 year Strategic Plan Workshop. The purpose of the first workshop was to identify and address the dominant social issues in Lethbridge and the demographic groups most affected. There were many important social



issues brought up by the diverse group of key stakeholders at this workshop. Although all are important for our City to address, I was pleased to see seniors as one of the key issues. As I alluded to last month in my newsletter article almost 1/3 of the City's population is over the age of 55. It will be important for the City to continue to support the social priority areas of Seniors (aging in place, accessing affordable transportation, access to information and resources and support of senior centres) with this new strategic plan. I will keep the membership informed of any new details that may arise from this strategic plan.

I am pleased to report, Nord-Bridge was successful in our 2019 FCSS funding request of \$216,850.00. The funding will support our preventative programs and services such as: social inclusion programs, Keep-In-Touch program, Outreach program, Wellness, Education and Life-Skills programs, Volunteering, Member Support Coordinator (Lorri) and the programs and services she offers, as well as our Seniors Helping Seniors Tax and Form Assistance program. This funding is for 2019 only and Nord-Bridge will have to reapply for future funding cycle years in 2019.

A friendly reminder; Nord-Bridge General Membership Meeting will be on Wednesday, November 7th at 9:30 am in the Multi-Purpose Hall.

As Remembrance Day (November 11) falls on a Sunday this year please be advised Nord-Bridge will be closed on Monday, November 12th. I treasure this time of remembrance for the brave men and women who gave their lives as well as the men and women who protect this country today. I try to instill this thankfulness with my two young boys in hopes they will realize what a fantastic country we live in and the opportunities we have been given because of those who sacrificed their lives and to those who serve our country.




