LORRI'S CORNER

Summer is finally here! I don't know about you but it sure felt like it took its sweet time to arrive! June was a very busy month with Seniors Week and also World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEEAD). Elder Abuse is more common than we realize and to bring awareness to this very real and disturbing occurrence is so important. Thank you to all who came to the WEEAD Sock Hop, showed some dance moves and had fun! If you are



concerned about the safety of a senior and suspect there may be some form of abuse happening, I encourage you to call Joanne, the LEARN Case Manager at 403-394-0306, your name will never be shared to anyone. If you would like information about LEARN, I have brochures and Joanne is here monthly. Please don't turn a blind eye if you see something,

please make the call and report it.

Over the last 8 weeks I have been facilitating the COMPASS for the Caregiver program to some incredible caregivers! I was surprised to learn that caregivers save the government over 25 BILLION dollars ANNUALLY in unpaid labour. Most of us are, have been, or will be a caregiver at some point and the hours and days are long, can be a challenge and also very lonely. If you know a caregiver, let them know you see them, offer to give them a hand with a chore or even something to give them a small break; this is a gift that can change their day. If you are a caregiver and are interested in taking this program, I am making an interest list for a fall COMPASS group. I will need at least 5 people to run the group, so tell caregivers you know also.

A few weeks ago a very special lady in my life died and although she was nearly 95, I was still saddened by her death. She cried tears of joy at my wedding, watched my babies when their siblings were being born and loved us all unconditionally. Sadly, due to her declining health and my increasing busyness with work, I wasn't able to spend as much time with her as I wanted. Some of you have attended the Grief Recovery Program I offer here and know that sometimes memories can sustain us as we mourn and grieve our losses. I am personally grateful for the Grief Recovery Program which has allowed me to learn how to navigate the losses in my life past and present. I will be offering another 8 week group in September and encourage you to consider attending. There are over 43 losses in life that we can experience, and this program works for all kinds of loss. We were never taught how to lose someone or something. If you want more information about the 43 losses or the program, please come

My youngest daughter is having her second baby in July and this Nana has been told I need to be there. How can I say no? I am so excited to meet grandbaby #7! 




