LORRI'S CORNER

Petal Power: 10 Surprising Benefits of

1. Looking after plants gives us a sense of responsibility and purpose. Sometimes our life can feel like it lacks purpose and tending plants can bring a purpose to our day!

2. Gardening allows us all to be nurturers. It doesn't matter what age we are or if

we are male or female, gardening emphasizes that we are all nurturers. Horticulture is a great equalizer: plants don't give a fig who is tending them and can help boost our selfesteem and wellbeing. 3. Gardening keeps us connected to other living things. Gardening can act as a gentle property of the universe. Self-



tle reminder to us that we are not the centre of the universe. Selfabsorption can contribute to depression, and focusing on the great outdoors – even in the pared-down form of a patio – can encourage us to be more aware. **4. Gardening helps us relax and let go.** For many, the peacefulness associated with gardening comes not from its social aspect, but the opposite; it enables us to escape from other people. 'Flowers are restful to look at. They have no emotions or conflict,' said Freud. Tending to plants allows us to tap into the carefree part of ourselves with no deadlines, mortgage or annoying colleagues to worry about. **5. Working in nature releases happy hormones.** To say that gardening encourages us to exercise and spend time outdoors might seem a statement of the obvious, but what is good for the body is also good for the mind. When we exercise levels of serotonin and dopamine (hormones that make us feel good) rise and the level of cortisol (a hormone associated with stress), is lowered. 6. Being surrounded by plants and flowers reminds us to live in the present moment. When we let go of ruminating on the past or worrying about the future and instead focus on the here and now, worrying about the ruture and instead rocus on the nere and now, anxiety lessens. One of the best ways to calm the anxious mind and lift mood is to become more 'present'. Next time you're in a garden, pause for a few moments and allow yourself to be aware of your senses. *Listen. Touch. Smell. See.* Just a short time experiencing the fullness of nature like this can be very healing. **7. No matter our age, gardening is an excellent way to boost physical activity.** It can help strengthen bones, muscles, and joints and improve our ability to do daily activities. Gardening can also prevent falls among oldity to do daily activities. Gardening can also prevent falls among older adults by improving balance. Unlike many everyday activities that only involve the arms, gardening uses the whole body as we move around digging, planting, weeding, and watering. **8. Some aspects of gardening allow us to vent anger and aggression...**Clearly horticulture is not all sweetness and light: nature has its dark side too. In a similar vein, some of the therapeutic power of gardening is that it allows us to unleash our anger and aggression as well as providing an opportunity to nurture. Why beat pillows with a baseball bat or yell at the cat when you have a hedge to hack or weeds to pull! **9. Can also allow us to feel in control.** When we feel overwhelmed, and gardening can be a good way of gaining a sense of control. Trying to control other people is often unproductive, you're more likely to succeed in controlling your beds and borders, which can make gardening a particularly satisfying experience. **10. Last but not least, gardening is easy.** When it comes to growing things, for all its power of healing, the world of plants can feel intimidating to an outsider. If you're new to gardening you may well be anxious you won't have 'green fingers' and starting small is key. You don't need garden the size of a meadow to enjoy horticulture. Just one hanging basket or few pots along a window ledge can lift the spirits whenever you look at them!

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members,

As I write this month's article I am comfortably sitting in our air conditioned office. A quick glance at the weather forecast for the first few weeks of August show temperatures reaching highs of 30 degrees Celsius. A



friendly reminder to stay hydrated throughout the day and if you don't have air conditioning be sure to stop into Nord-Bridge to cool off.

The Front Reception Desk and Dining Room cash registers recently were upgraded. The previous systems software were outdated and unfortunately no longer able to receive technical support for any future software glitches or malfunctions. The Finance Committee wanted to be proactive and have a system in place before any technical problems occurred. The new cash registers were installed last month and have already proven to be more efficient and user friendly. We are able to track a member's purchases at the Front Reception Desk and more efficiently gather reports for sales in the Dunford Diner.

The Finance Committee also approved some HVAC ductwork reconfiguration in the west end of Nord-Bridge. Before Nord-Bridge purchased this building in 2000 it was home to The Chinook Mall. The existing HVAC and ductwork were kept in tact. As Nord-Bridge grew and partitioned rooms, the ductwork was slightly altered for one HVAC unit to service multiple rooms. This satisfied the need at the time, however, the current demand is proving not to be energy efficient nor meeting the demand for heating or cooling of the rooms. The altering of ductwork in the Fitness 55 Club and Medicine Shoppe will commence in this month causing only a day or two of disruption for Fitness 55 Club members. Sorry for any inconvenience this may cause any of our members.
