

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This month I would like to focus on a few board members who I have had the pleasure to work with in my 17 years here at Nord-Bridge.

Harry Fischer is stepping down as our

Board Treasurer after 18 years of service on our board. For the last 7 years Harry held the Treasurer position. Prior to that Harry was a board member and on our Executive as Vice President, President and Past President for 11 years. For over a decade Harry also volunteered filing income taxes for members of the community, where he identified many seniors were falling through the cracks in terms of not receiving support services and benefits they qualified for. Thus, Harry formed the Seniors Helping Seniors Program (SHS) here at Nord-Bridge. We estimate Harry helped file close to 5000 income taxes for members of the community. Thank you for your years of service Harry.

Pat Santa served 13 years on the board of directors as a board member and on our Executive. Pat faithfully stayed on an extra three years as our Past President, because of the vacancy of Bob Tarleck from the Executive in 2019. During Pat's tenure as President, she presided over a strategic plan that set Nord-Bridge in the direction of where it is today. Pat also was very involved as an ambassador for Nord-Bridge by being a representative on the Economic Development Lethbridge Board, at Winners Bingo, and as a Director for Alberta Council on Aging. Pat can still be seen volunteering in the afternoons with our Community Income Tax Program.

Although George Berg will still be on our Executive as our Past President, I wanted to highlight George and the impact and support he gave to me during my first few years as an Executive Director. George always offered guidance, support and encouragement, especially during the pandemic restrictions. His wisdom, experience and leadership has been a great asset to Nord-Bridge and its board of directors.

I have been fortunate to be surrounded by great dedicated leaders like Harry, Pat and George who have provided years and years of service to Nord-Bridge, its members and to the community.

I usually write about tips on caregiving, taxes, healthy living, or eating. I want to announce, last week I was blessed with the birth of a new granddaughter. Grandparenting can be very challenging and unique due to many of our children living far away, along with our cherished grandchildren. As a grandparent, all we want to do is give our grandchildren hugs and kisses as well play with them. My granddaughter is two weeks old, and it is all very exciting. The whole family is happy that little Sophie has finally arrived. She is very sweet and adorable. As a long distance grandma, I was not present at the hospital for the delivery. I was at my daughter's home in northwest Calgary taking care of my grandson. The anticipation and worry when your own first born is in labour is hard to describe. I shared my thoughts and memories to my daughter that being in labour is like running a marathon.



My granddaughter was born March 9, 2024 at 12:01 am at the Rockyview General Hospital. I was able to hold her 7 hours after

she was born, and Sophie is just perfect. The pediatrician checked her heart, lungs, 10 toes and 10 fingers. Mom and dad are proud and exhausted, sharing their new bundle of joy with family members. A Letter on the State of the LEARN Program:

As of February 29, 2024, LEARN was advised by the Government of Alberta that they will not be providing ongoing funding to support those experiencing elder abuse in Lethbridge. The current contract for LEARN Case Management services ends effective March 1, 2024.

The services offered by LEARN to those in need have impacted many, from older adults themselves to service providers in the city. As a result of this loss of funding, I am so saddened to have to advise that referrals to LEARN can no longer be made. For this, I am so incredibly sorry. This unfortunately leaves Lethbridge and area without elder abuse services of any kind, resulting in putting so many at risk of physical, sexual, verbal, emotional, financial and medical abuse, as well as neglect.

Although funding from the government has ended, LEARN will be applying for funding offered by the Alberta Elder Abuse Awareness Council in the Spring. We are hopeful we will get funding, but of course cannot confirm. This would also mean case management services would not be reimplemented until the fall of 2024, which leaves Lethbridge without support for up to 6 months, if not longer. This thought is both incredibly heartbreaking and scary. Please continue to check LSCO social media and website for an update, as we will ensure the public is made aware should we secure funding again!

Despite the Alberta Government not deeming it to be so, elder abuse services are necessary, valuable and life changing for those who have accessed them thus far and would have been for those who will need them in the future but won't be able to be connected. 
