EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Every year when the irrigation company calls to schedule our winterization, I know cooler temperatures are around the corner. As we transition from watering and mowing the lawns to snow removal season, we have always been very attentive to our snow removal contractors. This winter season we are in the process of securing a new contractor for snow removal. Thank you to Wuerfs Yard Services for the



many years of clearing our parking lot and keeping it safe for our members during the winter and keeping our grass green and healthy in the spring and summer. Snow removal is very important for Nord-Bridge and its membership, thus finding the right contractor to provide the service is our top priority.

Have you noticed all the signs on the front boulevard? It can only mean one thing; it's time for an election. As mentioned in last month's newsletter, we are hosting a Meet and Greet for all candidates running for Mayor and Councilor positions in the 2025 Municipal Election. The official list of candidates is now set; with a total of 18 candidates putting their name forward for eight available seats and 4 candidates running for the mayor's seat. A full list of the candidates (and school trustee candidates) along with information on where to vote can be found on the elections table or you can ask for a copy at the Front Desk. With so many candidates we encourage all our members and the community to attend our Meet and Greet (or any other forums and meet and greets) to become informed and ask the candidates' platforms.

Last month, the Minister of Assisted Living and Social Services, Jason Nixon, was invited to Nord-Bridge by Dr. Sayeh Zielke, Cardiologist and Executive Chair of Assisted Living Alberta. Minister Nixon was very impressed with Nord-Bridge and the programs and services we offer. The Minister took the time to hear about our successes and the pressure points we face with rising operating expenses and funding issues. Programs and services such as Alberta Supports, FCSS, Seniors Financial Assistance Programs, AISH, Assisted Living Alberta and the Office of the Public Guardian and Trustee fall under the umbrella of the Ministry of Assisted Living and Social Services. Minister Nixon was able to see first-hand what Nord-Bridge provides from FCSS funding and how our Seniors Helping Seniors program

assists seniors in the community to access seniors financial assistance programs that allow them to live and age well in their homes. On behalf of Nord-Bridge and our Board of Directors, I would like to thank Minister Nixon for taking the time to tour our centre. Also, a great big thank you to Dr. Zielke for her continued support and advocacy for seniors in our community.





Programmer's Report

Happy October, everyone!

This month I want to highlight a very important topic that is recognized nationally. During the week of October 1–9, Canada observes Ageism Awareness Week, an initiative of the Canadian Coalition Against Ageism (CCAA). This observance aligns with the International Day of Older Persons and invites us to reflect on how our society views aging and to challenge the stereotypes that too often shape attitudes toward older adults.

Ageism—prejudice or discrimination based on age—can appear in subtle ways: assuming older people are "tech-challenged," overlooking their contributions in the workplace, or using language that diminishes their independence. These attitudes can affect everything from health care to employment opportunities and social inclusion.

From a LEARN perspective, we often see firsthand how ageism and elder abuse are closely linked. When society treats older adults as less capable, less valuable, or a burden, it creates conditions where neglect, exploitation, and mistreatment can occur more easily. Stereotypes - such as assuming seniors are weak, confused, or dependent - can lead people to dismiss their opinions, ignore their rights, or overlook signs of harm. Challenging ageist attitudes is therefore a key step in preventing elder abuse: by respecting the dignity, autonomy, and worth of every person at every age, we strengthen protections and foster safer, more compassionate communities.

Everyone can help by choosing words thoughtfully, gently challenging ageist jokes or comments, and celebrating the skills, wisdom, and creativity that older adults bring to our community. The Canadian Coalition Against Ageism invites organizations and individuals across the country to host events, share stories, and spread the message that aging is living.







Minds in Motion is a program designed for people with early to mid-stage Alzheimer's disease or another dementia, to enjoy with a friend, family member or care partner. The program combines physical activity and mental stimulation in a social environment.

At Minds in Motion® a client will...

- · Stay physically active
- · Meet and socialize with others living with dementia and care partners
- · Get involved in activities such as board or word games, bingo, and other cognitive games
- Have access to information about dementia and support, as needed

Who is Minds in Motion® for?

Minds in Motion is designed for people with early to mid-stage symptoms of Alzheimer's disease or another dementia. Symptoms may include memory loss, confusion communication difficulties, and changes in mood and

Minds in Motion is intended to be enjoyed with a friend, family member, or care partner. The person living with dementia and the care partner need to be able to participate in the same room together during the program sessions, to support one another.

What can I expect?

The 2-hour program is divided into the following two components:

- 1. The class starts with a certified fitness instructor leading a low impact fitness class.
- 2. For the second part of the program, trained facilitators engage participants in social and cognitive activities




