Transition is often defined as the movement, passage, or change from one stage, state, or situation to another. Over the course of the life cycle, individuals deliberately and/or naturally



transition and find ways of adapting to the challenges they face. In some instances this happens naturally and methodically and in other instances the process is a result of events beyond our control. Transitioning to a retirement home or care facility often presents unique questions, anxieties and fears that may require assistance. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Greetings Members;

On a couple of occasions over the last several months I have mentioned within *Newsletter*, along with reports to our fall General Membership and March AGM, that Nord-Bridge was having an independent consultant conduct an <u>Operational and Strategic Review of the Centre</u>, including its management and govern-



ance. This Review has now been completed by consultant R. Bruce Thurston, who is a specialist in strategic reviews and planning, with over 19 years faculty experience with the U of L, Faculty of Management. Bruce holds an EMBA in Strategy from the MBA Program of the U of C / U of A, Edmonton. He is also a Member of the Society of Management Accountants of Alberta. The Review was a requirement relating to \$75,000 per year operational funding (2015-18) from taxation by the City of Lethbridge, approved in November 2014. The Review is an 87 page document which requires some serious reading. Members will be interested to learn about how Nord-Bridge compares with the eight largest seniors centres in Alberta in terms of member numbers, government funding, fees, etc. It contains recommendations for actions and improvements to our operations and governance, as well as a recommendation to the City regarding the need to establish a Policy on Seniors Centres and their equitable funding. The report was presented to Council on April 18, and is still being addressed by the City. Copies of the full Review are available in the Nord-Bridge Library for member reading. We will also post it on our website shortly. We encourage you to read it this way to save trees and expense.

On another topic Lethbridge East MLA Maria Fitzpatrick recently made a "Members' Statement" in the Legislature about Nord-Bridge. It follows here in blue. This is quite unusual and appreciated. Thanks, Maria!

day and June 16th for Thursday classes. However, the Tuesday, May 17 Keep Fit class will be cancelled due to our Housing Fair.




